## **Geography Today : An Encyclopedia of Concepts, Issues, and Technology [book review]**

*Geography Today: An Encyclopedia of Concepts, Issues, and Technology* offers a newer approach to presenting geography, emphasizing people's relationships and connections to the physical environment, economies, culture, and politics in various regions of the world. The author, Ian Muehlenhaus, is director of GIS professional programs at the University of Wisconsin Madison. The first part consists of five essays on key geographical themes written by subject experts: mapping and technology, regional geography, physical geography, human geography, and environmental geography. Each essay is approximately 30 pages, addresses several sub-topics, and includes a 2-3 page bibliography for further reading. The essay section concludes with case studies on specific locations that applied geographical concepts to solve pressing problems. The second part of the book is a quick reference encyclopedia, allowing the reader to explore 101 terms, themes, and concepts mentioned in the essays, but in more depth. Entries range from 1-3 pages in length. Occasionally there are some images, map, or photos, but text predominates. Each entry concludes with a few books or reference type sources for further reading. A short bibliography and biography of contributors concludes this work. This is a nice source and recommended for all libraries wanting to update their geography reference collection.
